We are the **National Centre for Accessible Transport**, called **ncat**for short.



Accessible is when something can be used by everyone.



Transport means ways to move people from one place to another, like cars, trains, boats or planes.



We want to make the world accessible for everyone. We want to change accessible transport so it is better for the future.



This booklet tells you about our plan for 2023 to 2025.



It tells you how we will make our plan happen and how you can get involved in the work we do.



This booklet is a summary version of our plan.



The full version of our plan is called **Designing an accessible world for all**.

About ncat



Our Centre started in 2023. Our aim is to do **research** and get **evidence** that can help make transport accessible for everyone.




Research is work done to find out new information about a subject.

Evidence is anything that shows something is true.



We want to

- get rid of barriers to access for disabled people
- make sure disabled people get what they need to live good lives.



Barriers are things that get in the way and stop something happening.

Barriers to access are things that stop something being accessible.



We will

- include disabled people in everything we do
- follow the Social Model of Disability
- think about equality, diversity and inclusion in everything we do.



The **Social Model of Disability** is a way of looking at the world that says people are disabled by barriers in **society**, not by health problems or differences they might have.

Society means the places and people around us.



Equality means everyone is treated in a fair way.



Diversity means lots of different types of people.

Inclusion means everyone is included and no one is left out.

Why ncat is needed



We know disabled people make a lot less journeys than people who are not disabled.



This can affect lots of other areas of their lives, like health, education, work or happiness.



We know disabled people

- have less ways to use transport
- are more likely to get hurt when they use transport
- have longer journey times
- might not be able to get good information about transport they can use
- might find there are barriers when they use transport because of the way other people think about them
- are not listened to or included in decisions about transport.







We asked a group of disabled people to tell us what needs to be done to make transport more accessible.



They told us




street barriers, like high kerbs or



- people need to be able to plan journeys in a way that is right for their needs
- public transport, like buses and trains, needs to be better
- people need better access to wheelchairs.







Solutions are ways to fix problems or make difficult situations better.



What ncat will do



We will think about ways to make all types of transport accessible for everyone.



We will work with lots of different stakeholders across the UK to get evidence about ways transport can be made better for disabled people.



Stakeholders are people who are interested in or affected by something.



We will use the lived experience of disabled people and stakeholders to decide what we need to do.

Lived experience means the knowledge and understanding you get when something happens to you.



We will use the evidence we get to help

- change policies about accessible transport
- get more **investment** in accessible transport.



Policies are official rules that must be followed.

Investment is how much money is put into something to make it happen.



We will think about the whole transport system.




We will listen to disabled people and use what they tell us to find ways to make every part of the transport system more accessible.



We will get evidence that other people and organisations can use to make transport accessible for everyone.

- to be innovative and ready for change.




Innovative means having new ideas and being creative in how you think.




Our plan for 2023 to 2025

Objectives



Our plan has 3 main objectives.

Objectives are aims for the future.



Our objectives are called

- 1. Generate
- 2. Translate
- 3. Adopt



Our objectives are about how we will include the lived experience of disabled people in our evidence.

Objective 1. Generate

Generate means make something happen.




We will use **human-centred** research to find new ideas and evidence.

Human-centred means people are included in things that are about them.



This will mean disabled people are listened to and generate evidence and solutions.



Objective 2. Translate

Translate means use one thing to make another thing.



We will translate evidence into new policies and ways to do things.

This will mean disabled people are part of policies and solutions that affect them.



Objective 3. Adopt

Adopt means start to use something new or do something in a different way.




We will work hard to make people and organisations adopt new ways of doing things because of our evidence.



This will mean we help the transport system to change.


Our plan for 2023 to 2025

Phases



Our plan has 3 **phases**.

A **phase** means a part of something.



Our phases are called

- 1. Create
- 2. Define
- 3. **Deliver**

Phase 1. Create

Create means make something.











This phase has started. This phase is to create **ncat**. We will

- finish setting up ncat
- make our **brand** better
- set up our board
- set up groups to do important things like work on policies and check our research
- work on projects to start our research.

Our **brand** is who we are and what makes us different and important.

A **board** is a group of people who check an organisation is run in a good way and follows the rules.



Phase 2. **Define**

Define means clearly say what something is.



In this phase we will define our main research aims.

We will






plan other events to talk about research.





An **expert** is someone who knows a lot about a certain thing.

Our **Expert Panel** will include people from disabled people's organisations, charities and people who are experts in access and inclusion for transport.



Phase 3. **Deliver**

Deliver means give something when it is finished.



In this phase we will deliver our **funding programme** called the **ncat research and commissioning programme**.



A **funding programme** is a plan to give out money that must be used for a certain thing.



People or organisations can apply for money from our funding programme.



They must use the money for projects that use our research and evidence. The projects must make transport more accessible for everyone.

How we will check our plan is working



To check our plan is working, we will look at our aims and see if they are having a good effect.



We will know we have reached our aims if

 more people know about accessible transport



 more people know about the lived experiences of disabled people and understand why accessible transport is important



 transport is more accessible for everyone.
